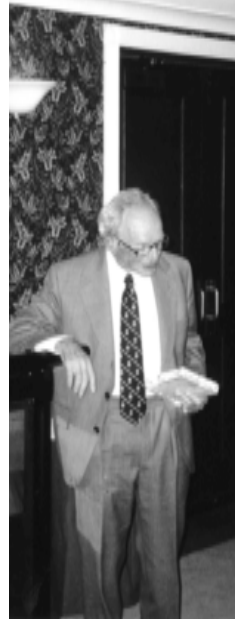
Jeff Bennett

CIS is pleased to announce the appointment of Dr Murray Horn to the CIS Board of Directors.

Dr Horn, appointed to the CIS Board in February, has been Managing Director of ANZ (New Zealand) and Chairman of ANZ Investment Bank (NZ) since 1998.

From 1978 to 1997, Dr Horn led a distinguished career in the New Zealand Treasury, becoming the youngest person to head New Zealand's leading economic and financial agency when he was appointed Secretary in 1993.

He is a member of the New Zealand Tourism Board and the New Zealand Bankers' Association and is Deputy Chairman of the Super2000 Taskforce and member of the New Zealand Business Roundtable.
